The Japan–Spain Forum was established in 1997 to promote mutual understanding and strengthen cooperation between the two countries from a long-term perspective. We had held twenty three forums to date, creating a platform for intellectual exchange on timely topics. 9:30 – 11:00 Session 1 : Initiatives for international peace and stability

As Russia's aggression against Ukraine still continues and the situation in the Middle East becoming more unstable, how to ensure peace and stability in the international community and create an environment for economic prosperity are top-priority issues that each country must share its wisdom to solve. Unlike in the 1990s, when this forum began, the Euro-Atlantic and Indo-Pacific security environments are now completely inseparable. More than two years since the beginning of Russia's aggression against Ukraine, Russia's procurement of North Korea's ballistic missiles and their use against Ukraine is a striking example. There are threats and challenges of various types and intensity, such as the advancement of North Korea's nuclear and missile activities, unilateral changes of the status quo and attempts to do so with respect to the East and South China Sea and other areas, piracy, terrorism, proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, and natural disasters. In addition, as the international community becomes increasingly divided and

confrontational, it is also becoming increasingly important for our like-minded countries to redouble our efforts to address various challenges together with developing and emerging countries in the so-called "Global South".

- ❖ In order to influence countries in the Global South, how have Japan and Spain been reaching out to the countries where they have strengths and what good practices do we have?
- ♦ How can Japan and Spain cooperate in engaging the Global South in various areas such as politics, security, economy, public diplomacy.

11:30 – 13:15 Session 2: Business cooperation between Japan and Spain in the global market

Given the current international situation, it is necessary for Japan and Spain to deepen their cooperation on economic security issues. At the same time, it is an urgent task for governments to redouble their efforts to promote trade and investment between the two countries, and as part of this, to encourage cooperation between companies of the two countries in the global market by using all possible tools. Discussions will focus on the green sector and infrastructure sector, a promising area for collaboration between Japanese and Spanish companies.

15:00 - 16:30 Session 3: Exchange in culture, art, architecture

The scenic Seto Inland Sea is known as the "Jeweles of the World" for the beauty of many islands. In Kagawa Prefecture, the site of the Forum, there are many contemporary artworks scattered in the islands of the Seto Inland Sea, as well as numerous buildings designed by famous architects, including the Kagawa Prefectural Office Building in Takamatsu City (designed by Kenzo Tange) and Chichu Art Museum in Naoshima Town (designed by Tadao Ando).

In the center of Takamatsu City, there is Ritsurin Park, which is designated as a special scenic site by the government and has received the highest rating of three stars in the Michelin Green Guide Japon, and Takamatsu City is working to revitalize the region by utilizing such cultural heritage and contemporary art.

The Sagrada Familia in Spain, which is expected to be completed in 2026 and is famous worldwide for its art and architecture, is very popular among Japanese people. Their Majesties the Emperor Emeritus and Empress Emerita visited the "Gaudi and the Sagrada Familia" exhibition in Japan from last year to this year, and this is a symbol of the cultural exchange between the two countries. The traveling exhibition in three cities in Japan was a great success, attracting more than 500,000 visitors. We will explore possibilities for further expansion of exchange between the two countries through art and architecture.
